Prior to this, Kuzma was a faculty member in the Humphrey School of Public Affairs at the University of Minnesota (UMN) for 10 years in S&T Policy. She has published over 90 academic articles, book chapters and policy reports in areas related to emerging technologies and governance and has served as PI or co-PI on several NSF grants related to nanotechnology and biotechnology governance. Prior to re-entering academe, from 1997 to 2003, she served in Washington DC as program and study director for U.S. NAS reports related to biotechnology governance and bioterrorism and as AAAS Fellow at the USDA. She has held several leadership positions, including the Society for Risk Analysis Council & Secretary, Chair of the Gordon Conference on S&T Policy, the European Commission Expert Group for the Science in Society Work Programme, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) Blood Products Advisory Committee, and the UN WHO-FAO Joint Expert Group for the Applications of Nanotechnologies to Food and Agriculture. In 2014, she received the Society for Risk Analysis Sigma Xi Distinguished Lecturer Award for recognition of outstanding contributions to the field of risk analysis.
