Liz has led the multi-institutional research and evaluation team for NISE Net over the last six years and has been in the Research and Evaluation Department of the Museum of Science since 2005. She was co-PI of the NSF-funded *Dimensions of Public Engagement with Science* project, and is currently co-PI of a research project on *Complex Adaptive Systems as a Model for Network Evaluations*, the *Multi-Site Public Engagement with Science* project and the *ChemAttitudes* project, where she will lead design-based research work to develop and disseminate strategies and materials to support chemistry interest, relevance, and self-efficacy. In her 11 years at the Museum of Science, she has conducted over 30 evaluations of public engagement activities including a research study on how visitors find relevance in the Nano mini-exhibition, and served as program chair for the American Association of Museum's Committee on Audience Research and Evaluation
